The <u>Canadian Coalition of Mobility Challenged Drivers</u> (<u>CCMCD</u>) was founded in 2017 by <u>Edward Rice</u>, the Chairman of the Ontarians with Disabilities League for Human Rights of B'nai Brith Canada, and <u>Louise Russo</u>, founder of W.A.V.E. (Working Against Violence Every day). Their mission is to work in partnership with government,

businesses, and non-for-profit organizations to strive for a barrier free environment for mobility challenged drivers.

A new app to assist disabled drivers with refueling their vehicles was developed and has been in operation for some time now in Canada! FuelService is being piloted by Shell Canada in approximately 1300 stations from coast to coast in Canada. It is free application, available for iPhone and android, and easy to use.

It's a simple 3 step process:

- Open the app and search for a station nearby for assistance;
- 2. Pick a station and FuelService will contact the station to ask if they can help;
- 3. If the station can help, they let the driver know when an attendant will be out.
- 4. Get the app here!

Supply and Demand

The doubling of rents and double-digit escalation in real estate pricing as referred to in the industrial real estate business is all about supply and demand. From a small business owner perspective, that is anything but true. When a municipality, a region, a province, and ultimately the national ground we live on is bought up by foreign REIT's and other multi-billion-dollar funds it is a monopoly and the people, the small businesses that pay 52% of our government spending must dig deeper to stay in business or sell out; that rises to over 90% of businesses when you add in medium size companies (100 or more employees.

If this type of development is ultimately good for the country, then the governments at all levels should stand up and own it while explaining the short and long term positive or otherwise impact on Canadian culture and development. Naturally, we should have listened to our purchase voices years ago when property was \$50-\$100 per square foot. But, when you are trying to introduce new products and doing your best to meet the needs of the customer, you do not pay enough attention to the economics of doing that work. Now, in this area the going price is between \$300-\$400 per square foot for industrial property making our move to an owned building in the \$6-8,000,000.00 range.

We will be at Caldari for six more months or as soon as we can find new digs; still, only at a 65% increase in rates. Thank you, PIRET/Blackstone for the accommodation.
