Tokyo Paralympics



The Paralympics were held in Tokyo 24 August - 5 September 2021 with 163 nations participating and 4,538 athletes. When the games were awarded, Japan embraced the challenge with all the energy and enthusiasm they had the last time they hosted in 1964 with

23 countries and 375 athletes. Despite the delays in hosting these games, it appears that everyone involved chalked them up to a resounding success; the hospitality shown was second to none and appreciated by all we have heard from, including those through the media.

As a former Paralympian, I looked forward to the games as per the spectacular event they are, on par with the Olympics. The Paralympics (derived from the Greek preposition to mean beside or alongside the meaning is to capture a parallel event to the Olympics). This is likely the fundamental reason that I have struggled with the games;

the Paralympics are their own games and not an add on or parallel event to anything.

The World Championships for wheelchair basketball on the other hand showcases a particular sport and that game is the focus to the event. Wheelchair Basketball as part of the Paralympics has traditionally been a super experience but this time I have a beef with the International Wheelchair Basketball Federation (IWBF) who were not organized enough to have their rules and regulations approved with the Paralympic folks and it ended up with some long time athletes of the sport ruled ineligible. No international governing body should be changing their rules for any other sport or organization. Wheelchair Basketball should has its own rules and regulations and if that makes them ineligible to participate in the Paralympics so be it. That sport is one of the few that are capable of making it on its own and the various governing bodies have not kept up to the development of the game on court. Shame on the National and International administrators around the world for not having saleable leagues showcasing the fantastic athletes in the game today. I don't rant very often but the domestic development in Canada seems to be at an all time low which dramatically impacts the next generation of superstars in the game. If that is not changed it will be a bleak outlook for wheelchair basketball in Canada.

The placing of our national teams well out of the medals in Tokyo was more an indication that the rest of the world is doing a great job, because Canada had incredible athletes competing. But, when the person behind high performance development working with athletes everyday is no longer in that position mere weeks before the event and the public does not why, there is a problem.

There is a problem if there are not enough administrators wearing it on their sleeve to drive the sport forward; and it is compounded by the fact that the domestic side of development has long since fallen off the radar.

You don't need to be an unwed mom to work with unwed moms, but it certainly helps that you have folks on your team that may have experienced life in that situation to provide a firsthand account for the trials and tribulations a person may encounter in that situation. Wheelchair Basketball Canada has one volunteer athlete representative that is on the group of 15 board and staff representing the sport. Some great folks, but how have we not spawned a group of former athletes or coaches that have the prerequisite to be involved in the game on the floor?

It is a good thing that the world championships are going to be hosted in Canada 2026 otherwise we may not qualify by then unless we make some dramatic changes to the way we grow the game here in Canada.

NSM Really National

Effective September 02, 2021, National Seating and Mobility (NSM) who bought up BC in this industry has made it official. They want to be national in Canada as well as the USA as they have acquired the Canada Care Medical Group (billed as Canada's second largest provider of home medical equipment [HME] and mobility services).



NSM now operate in five (5) provinces with 22 locations. They have a strong presence in the USA operating out of 45

states.

NSM belong to the Cinven group of companies which have investments in six (6) sectors (Business Services, Consumer, Industrial, Financial Services, Healthcare, and Technology, Media, Telcom). Of course, Cinven's values/vision (Ambition, Commitment to Excellence, Empowerment, Partnership, and Respect) are in line with NSM's HEART value/vision (Honor, Excellence, Accountability, Respect, Teamwork, Service).
