Ironically, he was injured on the job and has access to good funding with WSIB and would likely qualify for a lot of things he has developed himself to better meet his needs. Batec Updates

A Batec container arrived with products including Mini 2, E2, E2 Rapid, and Scrambler 2 along with all the parts and pieces needed to accommodate the 125 plus wheelchairs on the compatibility listing (10 more in testing right now).



The Batec Bloc has gained popularity with TiLite products who are accommodating by positioning the stabilizer bar on their ZR and TR series chairs, so the install is quick and easy for Batec products. For the Canadian market we have hooked up Pau Bach

(founder of Batec) and Mike Kozlowski (National Sales Manager) to come up with the logistics behind costing and the potential of having it detailed on the TiLite order forms if at all possible.

REE Future



We followed up with the evaluation of the 2023 Rehab Equipment Expo (REE) indicating our displeasure with the absence of end user admittance to the

show this year. Organizers have reached out to the

There is an update on the Loopwheels site to assist in determining which suspension wheels may be best for you including clinical rationale for their products.

Following the brief overview, click on the link below to better understand the only suspension wheel in production; yes, we understand that Softwheel is not currently in production.



The Classic is a good value wheel that offers everyday comfort, 70% vibration reduction, and pain relief. This wheel is designed for 120 kgs and speed rated at 7 klm per hour for daily use manual chairs.



The Classic Carbon has the properties of the Classic but with 12% more carbon to make it more robust to deliver more lateral stiffness and the more demanding end user.



Loopwheels Urban with its distinctive swoosh design is a lighter everyday use wheel with all the properties above built to accommodate power add on units up to 25 klms per hour.



The Loopwheels Extreme is designed for off road use with a mountain bike tire and right at home with power add on units to 25 klms per hour.
