Looking at the bigger picture, which I was recently reminded of, the National Wheelchair Basketball Association (NWBA), the counterpart to our National Association called Wheelchair Basketball Canada (WBC) is alive and well domestically, but with a conspicuous absence of Canadian Teams that have historically been involved in the various divisions of play south of the border. US players can compete at various levels of play within the NWBA and get world class competitive opportunities at home. In Canada, we have dropped the ball toasting our National Championships and making our league championships open to all comers who foot the bill to attend. Domestically, Canada would be well advised to provide more competitive opportunities for all players (including those considered outside the target grouping for Sport Canada Funding because of age) and showcase the tremendous talent in the country.

SCI ON - Full Service

It is sometimes inconvenient or not an option for a person with a disability to use the self serve option (which is most places now) at the gas station. SCI Ontario's web site has information on this subject like the following:

Esso – full-serve gas at self-serve prices at stations that have both services available; full-service at self-serve stations (disabled parking permit required); Customer Service at 1-800-567-3776 for more information.

Shell – full-serve gas at self-serve prices at stations that have both services available only during full-serve hours (disabled parking permit required); every effort will be made to provide full service at self-serve stations depending on available staff; Customer Service 1-800-661-1600.

Petro-Canada – full-serve gas at self-serve prices at stations that have both services available (disabled parking permit required); no information on services at self-serve stations; Customer Service at 1-800-668-0220.

Ultramar – full-serve gas at self-serve prices at self-serve stations depending on available staff (special driver's license required); Customer Service 1-800-363-6949.

Spinal Cord Injury (SCI) Ontario supports the work of the Assistive Devices Program (ADP) in Ontario. In their view, the 2011 Auditor General of Ontario's Annual report shows that ADP has made great strides toward improving efficiency and effectiveness. SCI Ontario is very supportive and appreciative of the work ADP has been doing in this regard. They also feel that further work is necessary to improve access, accountability, and customer service in these three areas:

1. Focus on excellent care and client-centred service – ADP must respond to consumer needs and become more accountable for the programs and services it provides.

2. Make the most effective use of resources – Prices paid through ADP for supplies and equipment must be established and maintained at reasonable and competitive levels. Consumers must have a clear understanding of vendor mark-ups and service obligations.

3. Enable access to essential assistive technology and devices – ADP must evaluate a broader range of equipment that is essential for maximizing independence, reducing secondary health complications, and increasing workforce participation.
