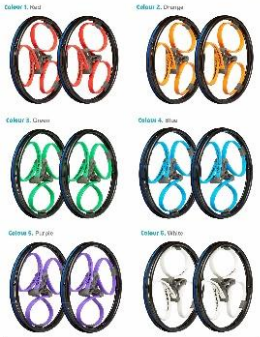

BATEC Battery Update



As you may recall, Batec produced a travel battery to meet IATA air travel requirements. In keeping with their ISO standards and best quality manufacturing the battery they developed tested over the 300 WH limit for a carry on to the aircraft battery. So, they developed a world wide battery rental project to assist Batec travellers; thankfully, we will no longer require that as the new 280 WH battery is now available. Going forward Batec will

offer three (3) batteries for their customers on all models (except manual of course) with the following specifications:
