2017 Hall of Fame

On Wednesday, October 18, 2017, the Canadian Foundation for Physically Disabled Persons (CFPDP) will host its 24th Annual Canadian Disability Hall of Fame luncheon. This event permanently recognizes outstanding Canadians who make extraordinary contributions to enriching the quality of life for people with physical disabilities.

This year's inductees are celebrated Paralympian Todd Nicholson, former CEO of CNIB Jim Sanders, Pioneer sport organizer Shirley Shelby and Paralympian and sports broadcaster Rob Snoek.

Paul Clark, President TD Direct Investing and EVP of TD Bank Group will be the guest speaker.

Open to the public 24 hours a day, seven days a week, the Hall of Fame was officially opened on February 11, 1993 at Metro Hall in downtown Toronto. In three decades, the CFPDP has raised more than \$30 million for Canadians with disabilities and the issues and vital services they require. Among its many important initiatives, CFPDP funds have been earmarked for creating accessible housing, emergency intervention and education for Canada's deaf-blind community, publishing and national public awareness projects like the Canadian Disability Hall of Fame and the WhyNot Marathon, and long-term and substantial support for our nation's Paralympic movement. Congratulations Vim and Dorothy (Honourable Retired Senator Vim Kochhar and Dorothy Price, Executive Director for another ton of work to bring us another edition of the Hall of Fame!

discuss the demand for accessible condos and the key features that buyers want. He confirmed that there is demand and he shared his suggestions on the key features and suite options that a wheelchair accessible condo should include. An advocate through and through, his efforts has resulted in the builder, Daniels, developing an accessibility program that they will be incorporating into two of their upcoming projects. Both locations will be offering 1 bedroom + den, 2 bedroom, and 3 bedroom suites with the following features / options: Roll in showers, Roll out balcony, Optional kitchen roll under counters, Wider door openings throughout, Power operated entry door to the suite, Ground level suites, etc. They have asked him to pre-sell these condo suites and he is registering buyers now on his site above. The first project is in Mississauga and is called The Wesley. It is part of Daniels City Centre, a 23acre master-planned, mixed-use community at the corner of Confederation Parkway and City Centre Drive. Square One Shopping Centre is just down the street. The floor plans and pricing for Mississauga / Wesley will be revealed at the pre-sale presentation on August 30 2017. The second project is in Toronto and called DuEast. It is in the heart of the awardwinning Regent Park revitalization at Sumach and Dundas Streets. BATEC Rapid Brakes

The difference in dealing with an ISO certified factory and one that is not, may be as simple as the following memorandum from Batec's Product Manager:

Recently, we have detected an issue when mounting the brakes in the BATEC RAPID and we draw your attention to units

This issue does not impact the brake effectiveness, but it makes the brake pads wear out more quickly than they should. So, there is no safety issue involved. However, owners are urged to arrange the changing of the brake pads during their next Batec maintenance. For those serial numbers noted above, Batec will provide brake pads under warranty and they are part of a container enroute to us now. The support document will be posted on our web site.
